COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

BIBLICAL FOUNDATIONAL CERTIFICATE	
<p><u>Christian Basics I</u> Whether you are new to the Christian faith or in need of a refresher, this course presents the basics clear in life application manner.</p>	<p><u>Christian Basics II</u> This course gives the student an overview of the entire Bible. This is a basic study for all believers who want to return to Bible study.</p>
<p><u>Christian Character I</u> How does a Christian behave? What is the character of a Christian? This course helps answer these questions with an emphasis on developing the fruit of the Spirit.</p>	<p><u>Grammar and the Bible I</u> This class will focus on the structure of the English language and how this knowledge can enhance the study of the Word of God. Book: <i>Learning English with the Bible</i></p>
<p><u>Christian Living in the Home</u> – Practical, biblical advice on Christ-centered family living, communicating with family members, family guidance and discipline, living with an unbelieving spouse, and many other areas.</p>	
GENERAL THEOLOGY CERTIFICATE	
<p><u>General Epistles</u> This is a study of five powerful New Testament books, James through Jude, also known as the General or Catholic epistles that contribute to the understanding of salvation, sanctification and Christian living.</p>	<p><u>Hermeneutics II</u> Advance level exploration of the appropriate rules needed to properly interpret the scripture for greater understanding and development.</p>
<p><u>Letter to the Hebrews</u> A clear, concise study of both ministry of Christ and the work of faith.</p>	<p><u>Second Letter to the Corinthians</u> The second book to the church at Corinth focuses on the havoc caused by false teaching.</p>
<p><u>Letter to the Galatians</u> Students will learn that they are justified by faith in Jesus Christ--by nothing less and nothing more--and that they are sanctified not by legalistic works but by the obedience that comes from faith in God's work for them.</p>	<p><u>Letter to the Colossians</u> Students will study the book of Colossians, which presents the absolute supremacy and authority of Jesus Christ in all things – family, the church, the workplace and all creation .</p>
<p><u>Letter to the Ephesians</u> This course will help you look into eternity past and understand God's plan for His church. It also instructs us how to fulfill God's will in our individual lives.</p>	<p><u>Letter to the Romans</u> The contrast between law and grace is examined in this course.</p>
<p><u>Synoptic Gospels</u> Students will examine Matthew, Mark, and Luke in how they are in harmony with the life of Christ.</p>	<p><u>Major Bible Doctrines</u> The study of God, sin, and salvation are some of the doctrines discussed in this course.</p>
<p><u>Book of Genesis</u> The beginnings of all things – man, family, sin, life, death and confusion.</p>	<p><u>Survey of the Gospel of John</u> The book of John seeks to provide the student with basic facts of Jesus' Deity.</p>
ELECTIVES	
<p><u>Understanding the Kingdom of God/Kingdom of Heaven</u> - This is a comprehensive study of God's original plan for humanity, equipping the believer with an understanding of Jesus Christ as King, the message of the gospel and one's place and position in the Kingdom of God.</p>	
<p><u>Tabernacle – True Worship</u> This examination of the tabernacle will provide greater understanding of this place meeting and how it typifies our Lord Jesus Christ.</p>	<p><u>Book of Revelation</u> This study will make known to us what shall be the end or consummation of all God's redemptive purposes.</p>
<p><u>Cults and Other Religions including ChrisIslam –</u> Throughout this course, the student will be equipped with different methodologies and approaches to apologetics which will give him/her a foundation for defense in the face of various worldviews and religions.</p>	<p><u>Biblical Lands and Customs</u> The purpose of this course is to examine the people, places and customs that were in practice during Bible times. Students will learn how to use this background information to better understand the message and meaning of each book of the Bible.</p>
<p><u>Prayer and Fasting</u> - This course will deal with the main passages in Scriptures on fasting, but also with the practical issues involved. We will also learn how to improve your current prayer life with a study on how to pray.</p>	
ONLINE GENERAL BIBLE CLASSES	
<p><u>Jesus Christ and the Millennial Believer- Part 1- Online</u> – This general Bible class is a discussion and examination of Jesus Christ as King and the contemporary issues faced by the millennial believer.
